

## **74th plenary meeting of the International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC)**

Dr. Bruno BACHELIER received an education in plant breeding (Paris, France). Since 1985, he has been working for CIRAD, a French agricultural research organization involved in the development in the South. Bruno spent 13 years in Central Africa, as cotton breeder and technologist. In the frame of his PhD, he conducted research activities on seed-coat fragments, using image analysis. His professional experiences on cotton and fibers drove him to collaborate with partners in Europe, Africa, Asia, and America. Co-author of several journal articles and book chapters, he coordinated the writing of a cotton quality manual for the West and Central African cotton sector. Today, Bruno is assistant director of a CIRAD research unit working on Agroecology and Sustainable Intensification of Annual Crops. He is the cotton supply chain correspondent of CIRAD, and member of the ICAC SEEP panel on social, environmental and economic performance of cotton.
